



Concourse B Expansion Opening at JIA in 2026

The Jacksonville International Airport will open the new and expanded Concourse B, comprising of six gates, at least five of which will be operated by American Airlines.

New Restaurants and amenities will also be opening in the new concourse, to be announced at a later date.

This new concourse will allow the airport to facilitate 10 million passengers through 2035.

More parking will also be opening in June 2026. A new 6 level garage will include close to 800 more spaces.



Visit Jacksonville is a Certified Autism Center

Visit Jacksonville is Florida's first destination management organization to earn the Certified Autism Center™ (CAC) designation.

Our staff underwent training to better understand and meet the needs of autistic visitors and their families and the designation was granted by the International Board of Credentialing and Continuing Education Standards (IBCCES).

A recent survey of parents, families, and autistic individuals conducted by IBCCES discovered that 94% of respondents would take more vacations or visit more new places if they had access to autism-trained and certified options.



Prime F. Osborn III Convention Center

The recently renovated Prime F. Osborn III Convention Center blends state-of-the-art technology with the grandeur of the historic former train terminal. The convention center offers more than 275,000 gross square feet of flexible indoor and outdoor space. Located in downtown, and minutes from the airport and over 2,300 hotel rooms, the Convention Center is the perfect setting for conventions, tradeshows, meetings, and banquets.






EverBank Stadium

Daily's Place

Daily's Place is the newest sports and entertainment destination in downtown Jacksonville, Fla. Constructed in 2017, it sits adjacent to EverBank Stadium. It has 90,000 sq feet of event space, and a capacity of 5,500. Use the entire facility for a festival or trade show, or select a space specifically suited to the needs of your one-of-akind event.

The attached Flex Field will soon be renovated and converted into an exhibit hall. A floor will be installed and could possibly also be used for basketball games.





Florida Theatre

The venue offers a 1,900-seat theatre with incredible acoustics and near-perfect sightlines, on two levels, with two lobbies and a private area for your event needs. Inside the theatre, state-of-the-art sound and lighting systems will enhance the look of your event. Includes a 40-foot movie screen, a digital marquee, red carpet availability, marble bars, and prominent on-street window displays.

Expansion of the historic Florida Theatre will create a 3,000-square-foot VIP lounge connected with the mezzanine. The \$10 million renovation is scheduled to be completed in time for the venue's centennial celebration in 2027.





Conference Center at the Main Library

Set in the heart of downtown, their unique venue spaces are designed to accommodate a small intimate party to a large affair. With 20,000 square feet of sophisticated space dedicated to special events, the Conference Center at the Main Library has something for everyone and for every function.

Included is a full catering kitchen, lighting controls, multimedia technology, a wide range of equipment and furniture, and professional security.



Emerald Station Premier Event Venue

Nestled in the Phoenix Arts & Innovation District, this unique 500 person event space is housed in a fully renovated, 100-year-old warehouse. The character and history of the building are beautifully preserved with exposed wooden beams and original brick details, offering an atmosphere that is both modern and timeless.

Take advantage of a beautifully designed shared kitchen, perfect for casual meetings and socializing. The space also includes showers, fully-equipped conference rooms for your professional needs and a community lounge where you can relax and network with like-minded individuals The event space features two green rooms, in house catering kitchen and brand new facilities.

The St. Johns River Park & Friendship Fountain

St. Johns River Park, located on the Southbank waterfront and home to Friendship Fountain, is now open! This \$6 million upgraded fountain features fully functional dancing jets choreographed to music and lights, boasting "water cinema" every 15 minutes.

Further enhancing the experience is a fountain projection show, projection on the façade of the Performing Arts Center across the river, and lighting on the Acosta Bridge. The fountain shows entertain residents and visitors nightly.





Lift Ev'ry Voice and Sing Park

Dedicated to the birth site of the Johnson brothers is the "Lift Ev'ry Voice and Sing" Park.

The park is named after the song written by John Rosamond Johnson & James Weldon Johnson in the late 1800s, which the NAACP calls the "Black National Anthem." The park will be designed to celebrate the African-American experience and will link to other historic neighborhoods via the Emerald Trail.

The park opened in June 2024!





Jacksonville Beach

With 1,100 miles of navigable water, Jax has more shoreline than any other city in the nation.

Just a few minutes from Downtown, Jacksonville's white sand beaches await you. Spend a day unwinding by the ocean and enjoy the nearby shops, restaurants, attractions, and nightlife.

After sustaining damage nearly six years ago, the Jacksonville Beach Fishing Pier reopened to the public with its repairs in July 2022.

The pier is now 8 feet higher and constructed of four 24-inch square piles per section instead of the previous three 18-inch piles.





Jacksonville Naval Museum - USS Orleck

The Orleck, a Gearing Class destroyer with 18 battle stars, is one of the most distinguished ships of all time. Having served in the Cold, Korean, & Vietnam Wars she not only represents the rich Naval Heritage of Jacksonville but also honors all military veterans in the Region. Naval Reunions, Galas, & Leadership symposiums can be held at the museum.

An ADA-accessible outdoor event space on the dock next to the Orleck will be open soon, and can accommodate 1000 guests under a tent.





St. John's Town Center

The open-air St. John's Town Center has more than 175 of the hottest retailers and restaurants including Apple, Sephora, The Capital Grille, Tiffany & Co., Banana Republic, PF Changs, Louis Vuitton and more.

New openings include Shake Shack, Mayday Ice Cream, and DOS Coffee & Wine.





Artist Walk

Motorists driving under the Fuller Warren Bridge on Park Street may have noticed metal structures shaped like the letters J, A and X being installed during 2023.


Those structures form ramps of a skateboarding facility that serves as the centerpiece for Artist Walk, an \$8.8 million public plaza also includes a stage and turf lawn.

The plaza stretches from Park Street to Riverside Avenue and connects the Emerald Trail, Northbank Riverwalk and Fuller Warren Shared Use Path.



Decca Live


Decca Live opened at the end of January 2025 in downtown Jacksonville! This new concert venue and rooftop bar, a historic downtown building has 10,400 square feet plus a 2,250 square foot covered rooftop space with openair bar.

Emerald Trail

The Emerald Trail Master Plan will create an outdoor destination 30-mile network of bicycle and pedestrian trails of greenways and parks that will encircle the urban core and link Downtown with at least 14 historic neighborhoods, 16 schools, two colleges and nearly 30 parks, among restaurants, retail and businesses.

Phase one is a 1.3-mile "Model Project" to connect the existing S-Line Rail Trail in Springfield to the McCoys Creek Greenway and Park Street. Approximately 40% of the entire project is in the design or construction phase. The trail is anticipated to offer a boost of social and economic development in areas.

Rivers Edge: Life on the St. Johns

Rivers Edge - with a vision for sustainable design - will encourage a healthy lifestyle & diversity. The development will bring up to 950 residential units, 147 hotel rooms, 200k sq ft office space, 134k sq ft retail, a 125-slip public marina and four acres of public park space to the vacant, 30-acre site on Downtown's Southbank.

The park space includes a large central riverfront park that will tell the story of Jacksonville's extraordinary medical facilities through art, exercise, gardens and interactive features.

Active water access abounds with a marsh boardwalk, an extension of the Riverwalk and a kayak launch.

Another 750 multifamily units on two central parcels next to a future city park is also in the works. Opening date is currently unknown.



One Riverside

Development is in the works for a mixed-use project with retail, office, restaurant and apartments at the 18-acre former Florida-Times Union site which would be developed concurrent with the day-lighting and restoration of McCoy's Creek, which also adds a 2.5-acre park on the Emerald Trail.

Phase 1 will include 271 multi-family units, 39,256 sq ft of retail (including a Whole Foods and riverfront restaurant) and a parking garage

Phase 2 will include 115 multi-family units and 15,000 sf of retail and a possible marina. In total, the development will have three restaurants – with one overlooking the river.

Expected to open in 2025.





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The Block Jax

The project, developed by the owner of dog park and bar Kanine Social, will be an outdoor food hall with 8 vendors, a craft beer bar, live music venue, 30-foot-wide LED video wall for sports and movies, lawn and arcade games, a golf simulator, and a fenced-in play park for children.

A second location of Kanine Social will also be developed at the new site along Gate Parkway. Admission will be free and the tagline is "Food. Family. Fun." The project will be developed for all-weather days, and boasts a covered area with a stage specifically for community events.

The project is anticipated to open in summer 2025.





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Riverfront Plaza

Riverfront Plaza, formerly the site of the Jacksonville Landing, is an open green space on the bank of the St. Johns River in the heart of Downtown. This space is managed by Jax Parks, the City of Jacksonville's Parks and Recreation branch and is available for event permitting for large and small events.

Phase 1 of Riverfront Plaza is now under construction and includes an elevated destination playground on top of a park pavilion building, a large flexible event lawn, as well as a new bulkhead, riverwalk, and a plaza space connecting Riverfront Plaza to the Jacksonville Center for the Performing Arts. The park pavilion building will include a small café space, restrooms, mechanical rooms and storage space to support the park. Phase 1 is slated for late 2025 completion.

Phase 2 of Riverfront Plaza will include a beer garden, rain garden, and a bike and pedestrian connection to the Main Street Bridge. Phase 2 is anticipated to start in early 2026 with an anticipated completion of 2027.










VyStar Ballpark

Construction has begun on the new \$11.5 million right-field building at VyStar Ballpark. The two-story, 18,500-square-foot building will house a Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp team merchandise store, hospitality area overlooking the field, a commercial kitchen, storage space and administrative offices.

In 2024, the Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp announced the \$31.8 million publicly funded Project Next renovation plan for the ballpark. The plan includes a larger videoboard, enhanced club space behind home plate, a new multilevel building in right field and a front porch and center field plaza to welcome fans.

It will be completed in phases by the opening of the 2025 season. Plans for the right field building include making the Jumbo Shrimp VyStar Credit Union Souvenir Store accessible on the street level, and creating banquet and meeting space on the concourse level.



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Jacksonville Armada Soccer Stadium

The Jacksonville Armada Soccer team plans to break ground on their new stadium in Late January 2025 and begin play there by September 2026.

The stadium will have seating on four sides, two with covered tiers, and lower uncovered seating areas along the other two. Estimated to be at least 2,500 seats.

The site is in the Sports and Entertainment District just north of the Vystar Ballpark. Completion is expected in 2026.




One Ocean Resort & Spa

One Ocean Resort & Spa has been purchased by Aspect Real Estate Group, Sage Hospitality Group, Corner Lot and Kelco Management & Development, Inc. and are planning renovations in 2025.

The hotel currently has 9 stories, 193 rooms, many with ocean views, and is located in Beaches Town Center in Atlantic Beach.

Included at the hotel is a fine-dining restaurant, adjoining bar, and a spa.



Congaree & Penn

The Winery and Farm will begin an expansion project in early 2025. The plan is to include new dining areas, quick service food stations, a larger event space, expanded retail options, and 24 cabins in the Oak Hammock where guests can stay overnight on the property.

This will also include increasing their fruit production acres from 50 to 110, and hope to increase their visitation from 35,000 visitors to 65,000 visitors annually.





JTA Autonomous Vehicles

The Jacksonville Transit Authority will launch selfdriving vehicles in downtown Jacksonville beginning in 2025.

The autonomous vehicles will be a 3-mile loop on Bay Street, re-named the Bay Street Innovation Corridor. This will connect the downtown core with the sports and entertainment district with 12 different stops along the way.

Jacksonville will be the first city in the United States to deploy a true autonomous vehicle network for public transportation.



Jacksonville Zoo & Gardens Rezoovenation

The Jacksonville Zoo and Gardens has unveiled a new master plan and **\$52 million renovation**.

The main entrance will undergo a massive overhaul and be relocated allowing visitors to take a north loop, a south loop or both. The main gate will lead to the new Manatee River exhibit with glass wall enclosures. The manatees will all be temporary residents – considered wild and being treated for injuries with expectation to be released. The first project phase is anticipated in 2025.

A new education campus and lion exhibit are planned for the following years, among other improvements, including an event space for 1,000 people.





Jacksonville Fairgrounds

The Jacksonville Fairgrounds will relocate from downtown to the Westside of Jacksonville, adjacent to the Equestrian Center.

Plans include a 40,000-60,000 sq ft event and expo center, administrative offices, a warehouse style storage facility, multipurpose barn and an event stage able to accommodate multiday music and entertainment festivals.

Initial plans expect the opening to be in late 2025.





Downtown Dining Scene

More than a dozen under construction, in development or announced for 2025..

Bagels R Us opened at 440 W. Adams St. across from the Duval County Courthouse. It's open 7 a.m. to 2 p.m. Monday-Friday.

Cinotti's and Grounds of Grace

In November, the Jacksonville Transportation Authority celebrated the opening of the cafe and bakery and coffee shop in the JTA headquarters at 100 LaVilla Center Drive.

Pizza Dynamo & Pour Taproom

Work is in progress for the venues on the ground floor of the VyStar Credit Union parking garage at the southeast corner of Laura and Forsyth streets.

The Co-op Frose & Eatery

On its website, it says it will open soon at 218 W. Church St In addition to frose, a blended mix of frozen rose wine, The Co-op offers breakfast, sandwiches and salads.



Baby Got Brunch

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Former Jacksonville Jaguars defensive lineman Marcus "Big Baby" Stroud plans to open the restaurant in a renovated, 5,000-square-foot space at 610 N. Julia St.

The establishment will serve brunch all day, with a menu that includes such items as chicken and waffles, short ribs and waffles, burgers, shrimp and grits, salads, macaroni and cheese and slow-cooked collards.

Cocktails and mimosas also are on the menu.

Downtown Dining Scene

The Prudential Club

The restaurant and lounge said it will open soon at 1430 Prudential Drive, where an incorporated liquor store has already opened.

The establishment will offer an upscale environment and fare with 9,000 square feet of interior dining space, a 6,800-square-foot patio and a lounge with a 15-seat, full-service bar and additional seating for 75 people.

The club boasts a versatile space that can be customized to meet the specific needs of any event, whether it's an intimate gathering or a grand celebration.



Oak Steakhouse

The Greenleaf & Crosby Building Downtown will add Oak Steakhouse on the first floor in the former Jacobs Jewelers space at Laura and Adams streets.

Indigo Road Hospitality Group announced the steakhouse will open in late 2025.

A private dining room will be available for events.





Mayo Clinic Expansions & Hilton Hotel

- Addition of 5 hospital floors above existing tower with completion in 2026.
- Site work has started on a new integrated oncology facility including proton beam therapy for cancer patients. Will also include the first carbon ion therapy center in North America.
- Eight-story Hilton hotel with 252 guest rooms and upscale accommodations. It will feature a fitness center, restaurant, outdoor pool and 16,000 sq ft of meeting space. Completion slated for October 2025.
- The addition of a North Campus that expands its 392acre property to 602 acres. The property land uses for the additional acreage are designated as medical, related residential and hotel.





UF Campus in DT Jax

In late 2024, The University of Florida Board of Trustees Governance Committee voted to open the new graduate campus in the area surrounding the Prime F. Osborn III Convention Center in the LaVilla neighborhood.

The first classes are planned to start by the fall of 2026. Additionally, the highly coveted Florida Semiconductor Institute will be located on the Jacksonville campus. It's part of a national effort to improve research and development of semiconductor chips, the building blocks that power defense and aerospace technology, smartphones, computers, automobiles, and many other products that are necessary for daily life.

The Deegan Administration will work with the Downtown Investment Authority and City Council to provide 22 buildable acres at this site to the University of Florida for the campus – with the goal of design, planning, and construction beginning as quickly as possible in 2025.





Shipyards East – Four Seasons Hotel and Residences Jacksonville

Approved plans include a 170-room **Four Seasons luxury hotel** with 26 high-end residences, a 157k sq ft class A office tower and world-class, full-service city-owned modernized marina. The five-star hotel will include resort amenities such as a spa, pools and meeting spaces.

Plans include a \$4 million investment over 20 years to Metropolitan Park, creating a 18.91-acre destination riverfront park. Groundbreaking was November 2022 and completion expected in summer 2026.






Gateway Jax

Gateway Jax's \$2+ billion development pipeline spans 25 city blocks of high quality, mixed-use development in the Urban Core of Downtown Jacksonville and includes over 5,000 multifamily units and 500,000 square feet of commercial and retail space.

Pearl Square is a seven-block development nestled in the heart of Downtown Jacksonville's North Core neighborhood. The development will feature more than 1,250 new residential units, designed by world-class architects Morris Adjmi, SK+I, and Elkus Manfredi; a boutique hotel; approximately 200,000 square feet of retail space; and more than an acre of vibrant new public spaces, including parks, widened sidewalks, and a signature curbless festival street. This project, which reflects a \$750 million capital investment in Downtown Jacksonville, is currently under construction with delivery anticipated in 2026



MOSH Genesis

The Museum of Science and History is set to relocate and expand, more than doubling its size on the Shipyards East area of the Northbank. The site will include 2.5 acres for the building and 3+ acres of Riverwalk and park space, available for public and private events.

The future home will inspire the joy of lifelong learning, bring to life the sciences and regional history through captivating experiences and continue to energize the growing Sports & Entertainment District.

Projected 2026 opening.





Jaguars' Stadium of the Future

The Jacksonville Jaguars have announced their designs for the **Stadium of the Future**. The confirmed renovated stadium boasts a base capacity of 62,000.

The EverBank Stadium renovation will be akin to SoFi Stadium in Inglewood, California. It calls for a shaded canopy over every seat, reducing the Florida heat felt by fans by about 15 degrees. The seating capacity would be reduced from 67,838 to 63,000.

In addition, the stadium will include expanded concourses (140% increase in current space), 16 new escalators, 12 new elevators, 12 new restrooms, new viewing platforms at the upper concourse level and much more.



Doubletree Downtown Hotel Update

The Doubletree downtown is getting a \$14.6 million renovation and name change in early 2027.

The hotel will be renamed Hotel Bellamy and the complete renovation will include new rooms, public spaces, updates to the building exterior, and a new pool and sun deck.

This comes with a 10 year franchise agreement with Hilton Worldwide.



Aventuur Surf Park

Aventuur, an Australian-based surf park developer, has picked Jacksonville as the location for its next development.

The park will be powered by <u>Wavegarden Cove</u> wave-generating technology and is expected to open in late 2027 in E-Town on the southwest side of Jacksonville.

A high-performance surf academy, recovery and fitness studios, surf rental, skate park and pump track will complement the surfing lagoon, along with a member's lounge, beach club, quality restaurants and bars, rooftop glamping accommodation, Rip Curl flagship store and community amenities including naturescaped gardens, lawns and a kids playground will also be built.



Marriott Downtown Renovation

The Marriott Jacksonville Downtown has been approved for an estimated \$6 million guest room renovation on the fourth through sixteenth floors, as well as public areas.






Shipyards West Park - USS Orleck

Shipyards West is in the construction phase to transform into a 10-acre waterfront park that will be home to the USS Orleck Naval Museum and Jacksonville Fire Museum. Other potential features include kayak launch, fishing dock, volleyball and pickleball courts, food hall, and restaurant. **The USS Orleck has now re-opened** in its now permanent home. The relocated Museum of Science and History (MOSH), as well as a new visitor's center and the Jacksonville Fire Museum, will be part of the new park in the coming years.

Jacksonville, the 3rd largest navy installation in the country, is thrilled to add a retired Navy destroyer attraction. The USS Orleck is the most decorated post-World War II ship, serving in Korean, Vietnam and Cold War eras. In addition to being open to the public, it will serve as a gathering place for Naval Associations, crew reunions, and military conventions.





Laura Street Trio, a Marriott Autograph Collection Hotel

The Trio restores the glory of the 108-year-old Florida Life Building, 111-year-old Bisbee Building and 118-year-old Florida National Bank. In January 2025, Live Oak Contracting has announced the intended purchase of the 3 buildings.



Ambassador Hotel - Hotel Indigo

An historic building, the Ambassador Hotel at 420 N. Julia St, will undergo renovations to become a Hotel Indigo. It is reported that it will be a 127 room hotel.

The hotel was built in 1922 and was downtown Jacksonville's first luxury apartment building. It was converted into a hotel in 1943, and in 1983, received the National Register of Historic Buildings designation.



Independent Life Insurance Building

Augustine Development Group purchased the building—now designated a local Historic Landmark—in October 2019 for \$3.7 million, with plans to invest more than \$30 million in the redevelopment of the property.

The developer announced plans to renovate the **18-story**, **165,000 square foot building at 233 W. Duval St**. to include a 21,000-square-foot grocery store, 140 market-rate apartments and a 10,000 square foot rooftop restaurant, lounge and pool.



Federal Reserve Bank & Baptist Convention Building

A developer will convert the neighboring Federal Reserve Bank and Baptist Convention Building to The June Club, a private elevated and modern members club that will include a cabaret, a restaurant, a bar, private and outdoor dining, and a meeting space. Permits are currently under review.





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Jones on Hogan

Conceptual design plans were recently approved for Corner Lot's new historic preservation development, Jones on Hogan.

Utilizing a combination of new construction and preservation of the existing structures, **the project will transform the entire block into an urban mixed-use development consisting of residential and retail tenants.** Current plans include 103 apartments, two retail store fronts and a parking garage. In addition, the development will feature co-work office spaces, a fitness facility, tranquility rooms, and a terrace overlooking downtown Jacksonville.

Residents will have convenient access to downtown, the JTA Skyway, restaurants and entertainment opportunities. In addition, the building is located on the Emerald Trail, which connects the urban core to 14 historic neighborhoods, parks and greenspaces. Construction began in fall 2024.



Dennis + Ives Development

The mega mixed-used complex has opened its coworking space in the Rail Yard District of Jacksonville. It features 11 private offices, shared workspaces, virtual offices, a conference room, and a community kitchen with an outdoor patio that doubles as an event space.

The 7.15 acres and 96k sq ft. of existing commercial space will be also be home to offices, restaurants, green space, and retail space in addition to a music and event venue (1,000-2,000 capacity). The development is expected to change landscape of the area and make the Urban Core a destination, all within easy walking distance of the planned 30-mile McCoys Creek Emerald Trail project.





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The Upshot League
