Fort Caroline Park Itinerary



- Start by checking out the Timucuan Preserve Visitors Center. Their exhibit, "Where the Waters Meet", talks about the environment of the Preserve and the history of Fort Caroline.
- Families can participate in the Junior Ranger program to engage children ages 4-12 in the history and ecological features of the park.
- Relax and enjoy a picnic lunch at one of the designated picnic areas within the park.
- Take the boardwalk from the Visitors Center to the Spanish Pond, featuring an exhibit of the 500 Spanish soldiers, led by Pedro Menedez, who sought encampment in the area.

• After that, head to the Theodore Roosevelt Area. The peaceful trails include

vast grasslands and piles of discarded oyster shells, as well as the Jean Ribault Monument.

• There is a bird observation platform on site at the end of the Willie Browne Trail. Take in the view of the marshes and St. Johns River.
